News around The Highlands

Notes from the Board Meeting:

This was the first public board meeting for our newly elected board and they did a fine job. Highlights include:

-The road repair in front of the gates has been completed. Some areas of the road were down to 1” thick. It is all now 4” thick. See the end of the newsletter for some photos.

-The legal case of unpaid dues is now a closed case and the money received from it has been deposited into the HOA account.

-Mowing on the backyard side of homes on the west side has been done. Trimming still needs to be done. Ray Salyer is looking into it.

-There was a problem with the pool cover not closing due to the blocking of a sensor light by a chair. The sensor is in a small gray box to the left of the entry gate. Please try to be aware of this so it will not be a problem in the future. We are also awaiting the report of the state inspection.

-Crack sealing has started and it should take 2 days.

-We are getting a new garbage disposal in the clubhouse due to numerous issues with the current one.

-Once again- Please SLOW DOWN when driving up and down the hill. There are houses where cars cannot be seen when backing out of driveways due to the hill and it is an accident waiting to happen. Please be mindful of this. Thank you to all those who DO abide by the 25 mph speed limit. Explain this to outsiders as well if you can.

-Due to difficulties in mowing the edges/sides of the nature trails without injury, a new motion to address having Dirty Duck to do this will be made once we have written permission from the developer to do so.

-A new laptop was approved and has since been purchased for the HOA office. It will mainly be used by our new secretary, Carol Jackson.






