The Highlands**

We, the editors, are planning on being home on May 1st, but probably not before you get this newsletter. We thank Warren Brandenburg and Lee Jackson for helping with mowing the common areas. Bill will get to the developer’s properties as soon as he can.

There is only one home left pending a sale now. Once that goes through there will no longer be any houses for sale at the Highlands, for the moment. Look for and welcome the new faces into their new community. 😊

Brief notes from the Board Meeting:

-Chris Latall from Dirty Duck Construction was a guest speaker at the meeting. He explained why it is important that the section of road from the gate to the ‘No Soliciting’ sign (132 ft) needs repair. He would install a fabric underlayment and lay 4” of asphalt. His bid is \$28,826. Knife River’s bid for the same work is \$66,000.

-Grab bars will be installed in the women’s bathrooms to accommodate those who have issues with getting up off the toilets. The toilets we have now do meet the ADA requirements.

-The storage shed at the pool is to be used only for pool supplies such as pumps, hoses, extension cords and lawn chairs. The excess pool toys have been removed.

-The pool area, pool covers, and chairs have been power washed. More on this later.

-We have 4 new lounge chairs for the pool area.

- It is going to take \$2000 to get the pool up and running due to old equipment. The pool is scheduled to open May 1st but may be delayed due to chemical imbalances. An email will be sent out when it is ready for public use.
